Entry Limit → Roses and Cut Flowers - Two Entries per Class.

→ All Other Floriculture - One Entry per Class
(unless otherwise noted)

Entry Fee → \$2 per entry. Fee must accompany Entry Form.

Exhibits Received → Tuesday, July 2, 7:30 am to 10 am, Exhibit Hall

Exhibits Released → Monday, July 8, 12 Noon to 7 pm, Exhibit Hall

1. Local and State Rules govern this competition.
2. **Eligibility:** Open to California Residents. Exhibits in the Floriculture Department must have been grown by the exhibitor, within the county, district or community represented by the exhibitor, except divisions for arrangements.
3. **Entry Procedure:** Enter online at **marinfair.org**. Entry forms may also be obtained from the Fair Office, 415-473-7048.
4. **Flower/Plant Care:** After Floriculture & Horticulture exhibits are received they will be under the exclusive charge of the Department Coordinators. Coordinators will manage daily care (watering). If you do not want your plant watered during the Fair, notify Coordinator at time of delivery.
5. **Release of Entries:** Entries must be picked up in person, or any other person must have a signed letter of authorization from the exhibitor. Entries will not be released without claim checks. Entries must remain as installed and shall not be removed from the show prior to exhibit release dates as stated in these rules.
6. **Liability:** Every precaution will be taken to the handling and exhibiting of work; however, the Fair will not be responsible for loss or damage which may occur from any cause. Submission of entries implies acceptance of all conditions stated in these rules.

Division 220 Potted Plants – Collections
